Opening Remarks

M. Burton welcomed everyone, introduced new participants, and acknowledged that the meeting was held on the unceded traditional territory of the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh Nations.

1. Service Area Lightning Talks

A round of lightning talks highlighted new developments for BC ELN service areas and the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training (AEST). The talks were centered on the theme of *community*:

- D. Schachter shared how Arca *empowers* BC ELN partners as well as provincial libraries, archives, and museums through access to affordable digital repositories.
- M. Robertson described how WriteAway nurtures learners, participating institutions, and the consortium.
- G. Currie shared how AskAway continues to *engage* learners and outlined the service's action plan for the near future.
- S. Nishimura described how the OutLook OnLine Administrative Centre cares for public and post-secondary partners by advocating for software enhancements and providing front line technical support.
- A. Bondoreff provided an update on activities at the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training, highlighting the Ministry's commitment to accessible and affordable post-secondary education through initiatives such as the Provincial Tuition Waiver Program.

2. Common Suite Modified Proposal

L. Hopton facilitated a discussion on the common suite modified proposal using a Liberating Structure called W³ to guide participants through three questions: What Happened? (reviewing the facts), So What? (discussing the meaning), and Now What? (selecting the action). Sitting at round tables of similar institution type and size, attendees reviewed information, clarified understandings, and ultimately determined how the Steering Committee should proceed with the common suite.

To make space for participants' commitment to the topic, the decision was made to extend this agenda item and table the two items that followed.

The session ended with a recommendation to proceed with a common suite containing Academic Search Premier and Business Source Premier, with the option of upgrading one to Complete at no additional cost. The recommendation will be brought to the Steering Committee business meeting following the All Partner Meeting for a final decision.

A summary of the common suite discussion will be shared with all partner libraries.

5. Wrap-Up

As the meeting wrapped up, F. Jones brought forward a proposal to endorse an initiative presented by L. Epps earlier in the meeting – to write a letter to Minister Melanie Mark requesting financial support to First Nations people entering the field of librarianship. Attendees expressed their support for the proposal, and BC ELN will facilitate the process.

J. Bengtson issued closing remarks and thanked attendees for participating in the day's proceedings.

A business meeting of the Steering Committee followed the All Partner Meeting.
