1. Opening Remarks

T. Mundle, Chair, welcomed attendees and acknowledged that the meeting was held on unceded traditional territories of the Squamish, Tsleil-Waututh and Musqueam Peoples. Introductions were made at each table and Steering Committee representatives identified themselves to the room.

2. BC ELN Activity Update

- A. Cocchia provided a staffing update.
- L. Hopton provided an update on priorities.
- S. Nishimura provided a services update.

3. Steering Committee Terms of Reference Review

L. Hopton facilitated a session to collectively review the BC ELN Steering Committee Terms of Reference. The group agreed with proposed changes to: simplify the language/format; move the Host Site Officer role to non-voting and not part of the executive committee; and formalize the Past-Chair position to remain on the committee during the interim period between the committee changeover and the winter meeting, when the new Vice-Chair is elected.

Attendees were invited to consider the pros and cons of the current Steering Committee structure and discuss potential improvements. Groups then discussed whether any changes were considered necessary as opposed to desirable. The Admin Centre collected feedback to provide to the Steering Committee for reflection and reporting back to All Partners on next steps.

4. ILL Transaction Fees

T. Mundle highlighted that this was the culmination of several years of discussion around ILL transaction fees for non-returnable items. He reminded attendees that as a result of changes to the ILL landscape, the Steering Committee agreed in July 2019 that the topic of ILL transaction fees should be brought forward for discussion at the APM. A background report was distributed to support internal discussions prior to the All Partner Meeting.

S. Nishimura began by summarizing the existing ILL workflow in the SHAREit software underlying the Illume service. Following a question and answer period, attendees at each table discussed the elimination of BC ELN ILL transaction fees for non-returnables. Each table reported to the group what consensus was reached.

Ultimately a recommendation was reached – to eliminate fees for non-returnables, with additional considerations – to be brought forward to the Steering Committee at the Business Meeting immediately following the APM.

5. Back Pocket Pitches

M. Robertson led an activity during which attendees developed "back pocket pitches" – compelling proposals for BC ELN to have at the ready should the Ministry approach BC ELN with additional year-end funding opportunities.

6. Wrap Up

T. Mundle made closing remarks, thanked attendees, and reminded Steering Committee members that their meeting would commence immediately after close.
