

## **BC ELN Progress Report**

## April – September 2006

**Goal 1.** To build on existing projects and create new initiatives that take advantage of opportunities provided by emergent technologies and new resources to foster learner and researcher success.

Pursue new products and services that meet users' needs	<ul> <li>e-HLbc launched on time April 1, 2006, including Biomedical Reference Collection - Comprehensive Edition; EBM Reviews; LWW Total Access Collection, and Medline (OVID and EBSCO).</li> </ul>
	askaway Real People. Real Help, the Provincial Post-Secondary Virtual Reference Service launched September 25, 2006, a partnership of the Ministry of Advanced Education (\$130,000 in funding), BCcampus (\$35,000 in support for continued coordination), BC ELN, and Partner Libraries who provide staffing for the service. 20 libraries participate, providing 62 hours weekly of service. All participating libraries benefit. Libraries already offering virtual reference service are able to expand service hours. For some Partner Libraries, this is a new service. askaway is ready to provide high quality service through in-depth training of all participating staff members and double, triple or quadruple staffing to ensure responsive service.
	OCLC QuestionPoint software selected for Provincial Post- Secondary Virtual Reference Service by Virtual Reference Management Committee. Joint purchase with the Provincial Public Library Virtual Reference Committee secures best possible pricing and other synergies such as sharing of negotiating expertise and training opportunities.
	The brand for our VR service was selected. The service name and tag line are: askaway Real People. Real Help. This brand has been endorsed by both the BC ELN/BCcampus VR Planning Team and the Public Library Services Branch (PLSB) VR Committee. 1.3 Support and expand provincial resource sharing network	<ul> <li>An Ariel Document Delivery Upgrade was made possible thanks to \$100,000 in special project funding from the Ministry of Advanced Education. This is a necessary upgrade to allow libraries to upgrade computer operating systems on Ariel stations, replace aging scanners, and to provide more reliable service. Enhanced security features allow more libraries to send directly, rather than relying on the Infotrieve store-and-forward server. Each BC ELN partner library was eligible for one full upgrade, one receive-only upgrade, and one scanner. Libraries could opt for additional purchases at discount pricing (invoicing will be rolled into 2006 ILL invoicing).</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Ariel software purchased at 20% discount. The Fujitsu 5015C scanner was selected, a new model replacing the Fujitsu 15C scanners distributed as part of the 2001 Ariel project, after testing for Ariel compatibility by Okanagan College. Scanners were shipped to all participating libraries, in several installments due to limited supply of the scanners in North America as this model had just been released. All 25 participating libraries have received software and scanners and implementations are in progress.</li> </ul>
	reSearcher: CUFTS2 released and implemented by Partner Libraries, includes new Web 2.0 features such as tagging in CJDB. CJDB now has a MARC records export feature. New Forums developed for reSearcher support.

	<ul> <li>Reviewed and updated BC ELN Tier Structure, to reflect changes at partner libraries over the last few years. After reviewing information gathered from the Ministry of Advanced Education, from post-secondary associations, from CPSLD and from provincial legislation, it was decided that additional indicators need to be considered when determining tiers. Analysis determined that the following indicators would form the basis of tier placement for each institution:</li> </ul>
