#### **Arca Actions & Achievements 2024**

## **Key Numbers from 2024**

- In 2024, Arca members collectively avoided \$2.9 million in costs.
- 30 participating Arca sites saved a combined 37,278 staff hours thanks to centralized administration.
- Via Arca, local and global researchers have access to 263,717 digital items in 1,672 collections; these items include newspapers, theses, performance art, oral histories, articles, maps, and photographs.
- Visitors from 207 countries increasingly engaged with Arca in 2024:
- 94,965 searches were conducted in 2024; up from 74,997 in 2023.
- There were 394,662 pageviews in Arca in 2024; up from 254,931 in 2023.
- \$500,000 in critical funding from the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills ensures minimal impact on Arca sites during the migration to Islandora 2.0.

# 2024 Accomplishments

Growing membership: Welcomed Okanagan College as a new member and introduced a policy to allow non-library organizations, such as museums and historical societies, to join Arca.

Migrating to a new platform: Progressed on the migration to Islandora 2.0 by developing a detailed action plan, establishing technical infrastructure, and standardizing metadata across member sites. A dedicated Migration Specialist supported local administrators, while coordination with Discovery Garden and SFU Cloud hosting ensured smooth implementation.

Improving metadata standards: Established new shared metadata standards across all member sites, improving interoperability, discovery, and long-term sustainability. Thousands of repository items were updated to meet migration standards, significantly enhancing metadata consistency and accessibility.

Representing Arca's needs: Joined the Local Contexts Early Adopter program and the Islandora Foundation Leadership Group, ensuring Arca's needs were represented in repository development.

#### On the horizon in 2025...

- Migrate all sites to the new Islandora 2.0 platform.
- Release the Local Contexts Integration to enable the display of TK Labels.
- Launch Islandora Workbench documentation and a new ticketing system to streamline repository administration and Admin Centre support.

The Arca budget is approved by the Advisory Committee.
